INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The Anchor Global High Yield Fund objective is to provide Net Asset Value ("NAV") growth by investing in a portfolio of high-yield instruments with an acceptable level of risk.

INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The Fund will invest predominantly in higher yielding fixed and variable rate securities including corporate bonds and debentures, with no geographic restrictions and may include emerging market instruments referred to in this paragraph. The full spectrum of available securities, including non-investment grade paper, may be utilised.


The Anchor Global High Yield Fund may also invest in a variety of high yielding securities including equities, convertible securities as well as instruments that exhibit qualities similar to both debt and equity (mezzanine debt). When they determine that such an investment policy is warranted, the Manager may invest without limitations in cash and cash equivalents.

The use of derivatives within the Fund will be limited to protecting the Fund against currency and/or market risk and will not be used for speculation or to increase risk within the Fund.


The Fund may not hold more that 10% of its net asset value in derivative instruments.

FUND PERFORMANCE SINCE INCEPTION





PORTFOLIO MANAGER COMMENTARY

Inflation numbers out of the US have remained hot. This has the market on edge, and investors continue to pare back their interest rate cut expectations. Towards the end of April, investors pushed their expectations for the first cut back to December 2024. The more aggressive investors were betting on the possibility of further interest rate hikes. As the narrative of even higher for even longer took hold, bond yields continued their upward journey, keeping bond prices under pressure. Against this backdrop, the US Fed's Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meeting at the end of April took on more significance than usual. Fed Chair Jerome Powell appears to have poured cold water on further rate hikes and seems to think US interest rates are high enough. While rate cuts might be delayed further into the future, taking more rate hikes off the table has given markets something to cheer for now. In a higher-for-longer world, the yield on income is attractive at 5% in US dollar terms and 10% in rand. We, therefore, think that the lower-risk segments of investors' exposure should be aimed at earning attractive interest income. There is some upside to bonds - an inevitable rally when the interest rate cuts finally arrive.
